Leopoldo Nuti is Professor of History of International Relations at the University of Roma Tre and Director of CIMA, an Italian Inter-university Center for Cold War Studies. Professor Nuti has been a Fulbright student at George Washington University (MA, class of '86), NATO Research Fellow, Jean Monnet Fellow at the European University Institute, Research Fellow at the CSIA, Harvard University, Research Fellow for the Nuclear History Program, Senior Research Fellow at the Norwegian Nobel Institute, and Visiting Professor at the Institut d'Etudes Politiques in Paris.

He has published extensively in Italian, English and French on US-Italian relations and Italian foreign and security policy. His latest books are *A History of Nuclear Weapons in Italy during the Cold War, La Sfida Nucleare. La Politica Estera Italiana e Le Armi Nucleari, 1945-1991* (September 2007) and, as an editor, *The Crisis of Detente in Europe. From Helsinki to Gorbachev, 1975-1985* (London: Routledge, 2008).
