Jérôme Elie recently completed his Ph.D. in International History at the Graduate Institute of International and Development Studies in Geneva. His work looked at the end of the Cold War as a period of 'Systemic Transition' and intense reflection on the future of the United Nations. During his Ph.D., he received a scholarship from the Swiss National Science Foundation (SNSF, Berne) to spend a year at the University of Dundee (Scotland) and the Gallatin Fellowship to spend a year in Washington, D.C. (USA).

His main research interests cover British and American foreign policy; the Anglo-American Special Relationship; the Cold War; the history of international organizations and historical perspectives on global migration issues. He has published articles in the Journal of Transatlantic Studies, Relations Internationales, the Revue d'Allemagne et des Pays de Langue Allemande and the Refugee Survey Quarterly.

Since January 2008, Dr. Elie is the Coordinator of Activities of the Program for the Study of Global Migration at the Graduate Institute, Geneva. He also acts as the Research Coordinator of the historical project "UNHCR and the Globalization of Refugee Issues, 1951-1989".
