

Benedikt Schoenborn is a research fellow and lecturer at the University of Tampere, in a research project on transatlantic relations sponsored by the Academy of Finland. He earned his PhD degree from the Graduate Institute of International Studies, Geneva, and the University of Sorbonne (Paris IV) in 2006. His PhD thesis on Franco-German relations in the 1960s was published by the Presses Universitaires de France (*La mésentente apprivoisée: de Gaulle et les Allemands, 1963-1969*) and was awarded the Duroselle Prize as well as the AAI Prize in 2007.

His recent publications include articles and book chapters, e.g. “*Bargaining with the Bear: Chancellor Erhard’s bid to buy German reunification, 1963-1964*” (Cold War History), “*Willy Brandt infidèle? Les incertitudes françaises durant le Printemps de Prague, 1968*” (Relations Internationales), “*Der Kanzler sagt Nein: Die internationale Währungskrise im November 1968*” (Dokumente: Zeitschrift für den deutsch-französischen Dialog), and “*De Gaulle - adversaire ou partisan de la construction européenne?*” (in: Construire l’Europe, edited by A. Liebich and B. Germond). Before joining Jussi Hanhimäki’s research team in Finland in 2008, Benedikt Schoenborn has been a visiting fellow at the Norwegian Nobel Institute.
